Theme of the Solemnity of Pentecost

On the Solemnity of Pentecost, the liturgy invites us to turn our gaze to the Holy Spirit and to become aware of His action in the Church and in the world. An inexhaustible source of Life, the Spirit transforms, renews, guides, inspires, strengthens, builds community, fosters unity, and gives the disciples the strength to embrace their mission as heralds of the Gospel of Jesus.

The Gospel presents us with the community of the New Covenant gathered around the Risen Jesus. For John, this community becomes a living, recreated, and renewed community through the gift of the Spirit. Strengthened by the Spirit that the Risen Jesus breathes upon them, the disciples are ready to go out into the world to transform and renew it.

In the first reading, the author of the Acts of the Apostles presents the Holy Spirit as the New Law that guides and animates the People of the New Covenant. The Spirit enables men and women of all races and cultures to receive the Good News of Jesus and to form a united and fraternal community, speaking the same language—the language of love.

In the second reading, Paul presents the Spirit as the source of Life for the Christian community. It is the Spirit who grants the gifts that enrich the community and fosters unity among all its members. Therefore, the gifts of the Spirit are not to be used for personal gain, but must be placed at the service of all.
